Reimbursement for SBIRT (ASAM Level 0.5)

Alcohol and/or substance use structured screening: greater than 30 minutes	99409	CPT OP rate as of 7/1/17 = ages <21=\$50.34 >20=\$46.26	N/A

What is SBIRT?

- **Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)** is an evidence/community-based practice designed to identify, reduce, and prevent problematic substance use disorders.
- **Screening** — a healthcare professional assesses a patient for risky substance use behaviors using standardized screening tools. Screening can occur in any healthcare setting
- **Brief Intervention** — a healthcare professional engages a patient showing risky substance use behaviors in a short conversation, providing feedback and advice
- **Referral to Treatment** — a healthcare professional provides a referral to brief therapy or additional treatment to patients who screen in need of additional services

Medicaid Payer-Specific Requirements

- Staff requirements:
 - Physicians, pharmacists, and other credentialed addiction treatment professionals shall administer the evidence-based screening tool
 - Licensed providers may delegate administration of the evidence-based screening tool to other clinical staff as allowed by their scope of practice.
 - However, the licensed provider shall review the tool with the individual and provide the counseling and intervention.
 - The physician may also delegate providing the counseling and intervention to these individuals as well but should be available for review as needed.
