Abortion Services	MCOs are prohibited from covering elective abortion services. Coverage is available through the Commonwealth in those cases in which the pregnancy endangers the life of the mother. Requests for abortions that are referenced in Public Law 111-8 shall be reviewed to ensure compliance with State and federal law. The Commonwealth will be responsible for payment of abortion services meeting state and federal requirements under the fee-for-service program. The MCO shall provide coverage for necessary follow-up medical care post abortion services preformed.	Service authorization is not required. Providers submit claims through the DMAS fee-for service program. An abortion certification form, MAP-3006 must accompany each claim. The originating physician is required to supply a copy of the proper certification to billing providers. Abortion claims received without the appropriate physician certification will be denied. Different than under Medicaid, for FAMIS MCO members, not all CMHRS services are covered by the Department as carved-out services. CMHRS services that are covered by the Department include: Intensive in-home services, assessment for intensive in home, therapeutic day treatment, mental health crisis intervention, and case management for children at risk of (or with) serious emotional disturbance. The remaining CMHRS are <u>not covered</u> by either fee-for-service or managed care for FAMIS MCO members.
